Good Practices:

- 1) Include statement on plagiarism, resources, and link to Arts and Sciences' policy in syllabus.
- 2) State consequences of plagiarism in syllabus:
 - a. Will need to redo work;
 - b. Will fail assignment; or
 - c. Will fail class.
- 3) File a report with the Dean's office when you reach an agreement on consequences with student.
- 4) Contact the Academic Integrity Officer if you have questions or if you are unable to resolve the matter yourself.
